



California State Library Parks Pass Frequently Asked Questions for Cerritos Library Cardholders

Where do I check out the pass and how long can I keep it?

Cerritos Library cardholders can check out the California State Library Parks Pass at the Circulation Desk. The loan period for the California State Library Parks Pass is two weeks (14 days). Patrons are asked to be sure to return the pass on time, so others can visit California's beautiful parks. As there is a very high demand for the pass, it is not available for a checkout renewal. An overdue fee of \$1 per day will be charged for passes that are not returned on time.

Where and how can I use the pass?

The California State Library Parks Pass allows free vehicle day use entry at more than 200 participating state park units. To view an interactive map with California's nearby participating state parks, go online to CheckOutCAStateParks.com. The pass is valid for entry of one passenger vehicle with capacity of nine people or less or one highway licensed motorcycle at participating state park units.

There are some California State Parks where the pass cannot be used. Please be sure to review the enclosed "California State Library Parks Pass Ineligible Parks" before heading out on your adventure.

What do I receive when I check out the pass?

When you check out the California State Library Parks Pass from the Cerritos Library, you will be loaned the following materials:

- Park Pass Vehicle Hangtag
- Backpack
- California State Library Parks Pass FAQs
- California State Library Parks Pass Terms and Conditions
- California State Library Parks Pass Ineligible Parks List

Where do I return the pass, backpack and enclosed information?

Please return the pass, backpack and enclosed information to the Circulation Desk only. **Do not place** the items in the outdoor or indoor book drops.

How did the Cerritos Library receive the pass?

California State Parks and the California State Library provided the pass to public libraries across the state as an additional opportunity to advance safe and equitable outdoor access to all Californians.
